The Council received several requests for funds and we chose to generously give to Cañon City Schools for suicide prevention, early childhood mental health program, CCFD for fire prevention education, and for Eric Minton's medical needs. The recipients were very grateful for the funding — we will be part of making a substantial difference in the lives of many people! Maybe even save some lives.

Regular programming will re-start in August. Blessing of those who carry backpacks/computers/etc. will be during worship on August 11. Sunday School and Catechism classes will also begin. There will be a home Catechism class for students and parents on August 18 at noon at my house. Lunch will be served. Adult education will also begin again after Labor Day. We will do a book study this time—more details to follow soon in the Thursday emails soon!

September 8th will be the return of Fellowship Breakfast!! The Faith Formation Team will be your host that day. We will also be participating in God's Work. Our Hands day. There will be opportunities to serve our neighbors. Details will be coming in August.




